

Vision, Mission & Faith:

Vision: Happy childhood & child-centric education for all

Mission: To transform 'out-of-system' children into self-reliant citizens by giving them love, care, empathy and education through a free, residential, eco-friendly, coeducational, alternative school 'Kaliyuva Mane' (Meaning 'Home for Learning')

Faith:

- Natural resources and human resources are two essential resources needed for the development of any society, nation and the world.
- Every educated person with values is an asset to his/her country in particular and the world at large.
- Education is an important tool to transform ordinary human beings into human resource.
- An uncluttered mind is a prerequisite for learning. Love, Care and Empathy are the ingredients for creating an uncluttered mind.

Unique features of Kaliyuva Mane:



➤ Kaliyuva Mane is registered under National Institute of Open schooling - an autonomous Institution under Department of SE&L, Ministry of Education (MOE), Govt. of India (AA No. 008062), functioning on the principle: "School for CHILDREN & not Children for SCHOOL".

➤ All the children are provided with food, accommodation clothing, healthcare, recreation facilities and child-centric education in an atmosphere charged with Love, Care & Empathy. Kaliyuva Mane works on the philosophy, 'School for children' rather than 'Children for School'



➤ Admission process throughout the year as there is no fixed period for a child to fall into difficult situations.

➤ Beneficiaries: Child labourers, Mentally normal children with huge academic lag, children from rural broken families, school dropouts, dyslexic children etc. Currently we are catering to an optimum number of 100 children (68 boys and 32 girls). Apart from this, we are also supporting post matric education of 14 children.



➤ Adequate time for a child to feel comfortable and settle down.

➤ Tailored curriculum based on the child's current knowledge and age.

➤ Children are not divided into rigid standards such as 1st standard, 2nd standard,....etc, Instead, children are divided into flexible teams based on their academic level, pace of learning and interest. Meaningful names are given to each team. Transfer of children from one team to another team happens based on the learning of the children alone. It can happen several times a year.



➤ No fear instilling exams are held. Only informal tests are conducted at frequent intervals to assess each child's learning and to revise the curriculum for that child.



➤ Neither a formal Kannada medium school nor an English medium school. Core subjects are taught in both the mediums.

➤ Individual attention is paid to each child's emotions, interest & abilities, as happy minds learn faster.



➤ Children are appearing for 10th standard exam in English medium from Karnataka State Education Examination Board (KSEEB). 94.5% of students, including those with dyslexia have passed the SSLC exam, since the first batch of students in 2010.

➤ Support to X standard passed children for their post-matric education. Courses chosen: B.E., B.Sc., M.Sc. Dip. In Engg., ITI, B.Com. B.C.A., M.C.A. Nursing and other vocational courses. A few have become successful entrepreneurs. Many are gainfully employed.



➤ **Star Reward System:** Recognizing and encouraging positive attitudes in children by awarding them Gold, Blue, and Red stars.

➤ **Kids' Bank at Kaliyuva Mane Campus:** Facilitating Children's Monthly Cheque Deposits, Withdrawals.

➤ **Kids' shop** with racks of toiletries, stationery items, and biscuits, chocolates etc. children make cash purchases using specially printed currency.

➤ **Kids' Court:** Resolution Without Punishment, Tailored Transformation Methods

➤ **Eco Friendly Campus:** Dairy, Gobar gas plant, Organic farming, Vermicompost, Solid waste disposal system, Rain-water harvesting, Bore well recharging, Wastewater recycling & Eco-sanitation model, Solar LED campus lighting. Astra stove (Wood-fired smoke less bio mass stove)

➤ **Kaushala' - Skill training:** In Kaliyuva Mane, there is a good work culture where all children participate in cooking, dairy, horticulture, Campus Cleaning work including toilet cleaning etc., apart from academics, under the supervision of staff members.

We have constructed a skill-training Centre - 'Kaushala', to introduce all children of Kaliyuva Mane to various skills like plumbing, hair cutting, electrical, tailoring, welding, painting, etc. to hone their flair for hands-on- learning and expand their skill set. This opportunity will also enhance the scope of their job prospects after completing their 10th standard.

Profiles of children who completed 10th standard in 2022

Ravi S (15 years) belongs to a 'Below Poverty Line' family. His father is an auto driver. Ravi's mother deserted the family when he was very young. After his mother deserted the family, Ravi's father was the only breadwinner for the family. It was difficult for him to take care of the family along with Ravi's education. So, after completing class IV in Kannada medium at Government Higher Primary School, Krishnamurthy Puram, Mysore, he dropped out of school. Then, Ravi joined Kaliyuva Mane. He has passed the 10th standard exams in English medium, this year scoring 83.2% marks. He wants to become a Graduate Engineer. As the first step, he has joined Diploma in Electronics and Electrical Engineering course at Government CPC Polytechnic College, Mysuru. Kaliyuva Mane is supporting his education.



A P Niranjana (15 years) belongs to 'Below Poverty Line' family. Niranjana's father had passed class X and he was owning a piece of dry land of about one acre. Mother has studied class III and was helping her husband in farming. Niranjana had completed from UKG to class II in SYN convent, Ravandur, Mysore. From class III to VI in Kannada medium from Government Higher Primary School, Arenahalli, Periyapatna. Ms. Preetha Das a software professional was working as a volunteer in Kaliyuva Mane in 2018. She wanted English education to her distant relative Niranjana. So, she was instrumental for the admission of Niranjana to Kaliyuva Mane. Thus, he dropped out of the school and joined Kaliyuva Mane. He has passed the 10th standard board exams in English medium as private candidate, this year scoring 78.4% marks. He has joined Diploma in Electronics and Communication Engineering course. Kaliyuva Mane is supporting his education.



Sowmya G (17 years) belongs to a 'Below Poverty Line' family. Sowmya's parents were illiterates and were staying in a rented house in Ramakrishna Nagar, Mysuru. Her father deserted the family when she was very young. She was raised by her mother. Sowmya's mother was working as a housemaid. Sowmya was studying class II at Shri Rajeshwari Higher Primary School in Mysore. Sowmya's mother was the only breadwinner. She couldn't look after her daughter. Thus, Sowmya dropped out of school. After finding out the situation of Sowmya's family, Mrs.

Uma Murthy, a well-wisher of Sowmya's family advised Sowmya's mother to admit Sowmya to Kaliyuva Mane. Thus, Sowmya joined Kaliyuva Mane. Subsequently, she lost her father. She has passed the 10th standard board exams in English medium as private candidate, this year scoring 71.52% marks. She has joined PUC (Commerce course) at MMK Independent PU college, Sargur. Kaliyuva Mane is supporting her education.



Pranesh Mourya N (17years) belongs to a 'Below Poverty Line' (BPL) family. His father has studied II PUC and working as a security guard at Banneri Sugar Factory, Alaganchi, Nanjangudu. His mother is a housewife. Pranesh got a free seat under the RTE (Right to Education) quota, in the Dayananda Arya Vidya (DAV) Public School, Mysore, English medium, CBSE school. Pranesh's parents were very happy. However, Pranesh could not cope with the studies. The teachers were good and tried hard to pay special

attention to him, but in vain. The child started developing a complex. He secured an overall E₂ grade in the class V exam. In spite of this, he was promoted to class VI. At 11 years of age, Pranesh was not comfortable with class II textbooks. Pranesh's paternal uncle, Mr. Santhosh Kumar, made Pranesh drop out of school. A simple interaction with the boy revealed his academic lag. His parents were advised to take the child for a psychological & academic assessment to the clinical psychology department of All India Institute of Speech and Hearing (AIISH), Mysore. According to the report, Pranesh's IQ was 100. His grade score was equivalent to class I level on 05-06-2017 when his age was 11 years 3 months. He fell under the category of 'Children with special needs'. Pranesh's paternal uncle, Mr. Santhosh Kumar, read an article on Kaliyuva Mane and brought Pranesh to Kaliyuva Mane. Thus, he joined Kaliyuva Mane. He has passed the 10th standard board exams in English medium as private candidate, this year scoring 60.48% marks. He has joined Diploma in Commercial practice course.



PSYCHOLOGICAL REPORT

This is to certify that Pranesh Mourya N s/o Mr. Nagaraju C-Mrs. M Sheela, aged 11 years 2 months, residential student of class VI (State Syllabus-English Medium) at Kaliyuva Mane (An Alternative School for Underprivileged), run by Divya Deepa Charitable Trust, Kenchalagudu Village, Manandavady Road, Rayanakere Post, Jayapura Hobli, Mysore: 570 008, Karnataka, with home address as #Alaganchi Village & Post, Nanjangud Taluk, Mysore District: Karnataka, bearing CRF Nos. 452525 was registered on 22nd May, 2017, at this Institute. As per the records, the student is diagnosed as functioning at the level of **“Average Intelligence having Academic Delay and Learning Difficulties”**-a condition which is currently classifiable under the category of student with special needs having equivalent of 40 % academic delay. His current level of mental age as assessed on standardized psychological tests of intelligence and adaptive behavior is age appropriate (IQ: 100). Academic history and performance on achievement tests shows that his current overall grade score is equivalent of class I level. Past history shows normal developmental milestones. Family history shows that the child was staying at his uncle's residence till his class four with no adequate support mentoring or guidance in academics.

Owing to his condition, the student falls under the category of 'children with special needs' or 'disadvantaged child' and becomes entitled for illustrative list of benefits or concessions as mentioned overleaf.

Darshan M D (17 years) belongs to a 'Below Poverty Line' family. His father had studied up to PUC and was working as a farmer in two acres of land. Mother had studied class X and is a housewife. He had studied class I to V in English medium at Sumana Vidya Kendra, Mellahalli. From class VI & VII he studied in English medium, CBSE school, Vinayaka High School, Taripura, Mandya. During the COVID-19 pandemic, when all the schools were closed, Darshan's parents were worried about his education and he was lagging behind in his academics. So, they were searching for a residential school for

him to admit. But no school was open. As per the advice given by his father's friend, Mr. Shivalingu, his parents joined him to Kaliyuva Mane. Thus, he joined Kaliyuva Mane. A simple informal assessment carried out at Kaliyuva Mane, he didn't know to do basic mathematics problems. He was able to read Kannada and English but not able to write it correctly. This year, he has passed the 10th standard board exams in English medium as private candidate, scoring 60.48% marks. He has joined Diploma in Electronics and Communication course. Kaliyuva Mane is supporting his education.



Amrutha C R (16 years) belongs to a 'Below Poverty Line' family. Her father was an alcoholic. He used to beat her mother. At a temple fair, Amrutha's father was pulling the chariot. He got under the chariot wheel and was killed. Mother is an illiterate and she came to Kaliyuva Mane seeking job, and she started staying and working in Kaliyuva Mane. As Amrutha's mother was the only breadwinner of the family, she couldn't look after her three daughters. Amrutha's sisters joined the Jain orphanage. Her mother was working in Kaliyuva Mane, she liked the place and

wanted Amrutha to study only in Kaliyuva Mane. As Kaliyuva Mane was the only free residential school for Amrutha. Amrutha also liked to stay in Kaliyuva Mane. Thus, Amrutha was admitted to Kaliyuva Mane. Presently, Amrutha's mother is working as a helper at President Hotel, Mysuru. Amrutha, her elder sister, and her mother are staying in a rented house. Amrutha has passed the 10th standard board exams in English medium as private candidate, this year scoring 58.88% marks. She has joined Teresian College for 'Diploma in Health Care Assistance' course. Kaliyuva Mane is supporting his education.



Vinod M V (16 years) belongs to a 'Below Poverty Line' family. Vinod's mother was an illiterate. She had two children, Vinod was the elder one. His father was an alcoholic addict. After 8 years of marriage, Vinod's father suffered from paralysis. At that time, he borrowed money and started staying separately from the family. It was not a cordial relationship. Thus, the family broke. At that time, Vinod had completed the 4th standard in Saptaswara primary School, Metagalli in Kannada medium as per the

document. Mother started doing odd jobs. It became very difficult for Vinod's mother to take care of two children, apart from earning her own bread. So, out of compulsion, she admitted both her children to a shelter home meant for child labourers for a couple of months. Thus, both children did get food, shelter, and care. But did not get education. Then again, his mother started changing jobs and places quite frequently. Thus, Vinod remained out of school for almost two and a half years. Vinod's mother was working as a housemaid on a farm near Udburu, Mysuru. Vinod was helping his mother with gardening work, going to the shop to buy groceries, etc. His mother's employer noticed this and gave a call to Kaliyuva Mane regarding the admission of Vinod and his younger sister. Later, Kaliyuva Mane volunteers visited the working place of Vinod's mother. Thus, understanding the situation, both Vinod and his sister were admitted to Kaliyuva Mane. Vinod's father passed away in the year 2020. Presently his mother is working in a Garments unit. Vinod and his younger sister are staying and studying in Kaliyuva Mane. This year, he has passed the 10th standard board exams in English medium as private candidate, scoring 56.16% marks. He has joined PUC-commerce at Jayalakshmi PU composite college, Mysore. He continues to stay in Kaliyuva Mane and pursue his further studies.



Bharath Gowda N A (16 years) belongs to a 'Below Poverty Line' family. He lost his father when he was 5 years young. Mother belonged to Narayanapura village in Pandavapura Taluk, Mandya District. Bharat Gowda and his elder brother were staying with their mother, in their paternal uncle's house. Bharat Gowda studied from class I to class V in Government Higher Primary school, Mandya, in Kannada medium. Then, he studied class VI at Nirmala Convent, Pandavapura. He studied class VII in English Medium at Gopala Swamy Shishuvihara, Mysore by staying at the JSS Boys hostel. When Bharat Gowda was studying in class VII, the school teacher at Gopala Swamy Shishuvihara, Mysore, Smt. Sujatha observed that he was finding it difficult to manage his academics. She suggested Bharat Gowda's uncle to admit him to Kaliyuva Mane. Thus, Bharath Gowda dropped out of formal school and joined Kaliyuva Mane. As per the informal assessment done at Kaliyuva Mane, it was noticed that the child was suffering a huge academic lag. So, his uncle was advised to take Bharat Gowda to the clinical psychology department of All India Institute of Speech & Hearing, Mysore, for a psychological and academic assessment and advice. As per the report, he was diagnosed as functioning at the intellectual level of "Average Intelligence - Academic Delay and Learning Difficulties" though his IQ was 100. His overall academic level was matching with the primary level. He had a problem with writing, though he used to grasp the subject. This year, he has passed the 10th standard board exams in English medium as private candidate, scoring 56% marks. He has joined Industrial Training Institute (ITI) in Electricals at Sri Adichunchanagiri Private ITI college, Melukote. Kaliyuva Mane is supporting his education.



PSYCHOLOGICAL REPORT

This is to certify that Bharath Gowda NA (photograph attested below) s/o Late Mr. Anantha-Mrs. Neelamani, aged 12 years 7 months, student of class VIII (State Syllabus-English Medium) at Kaliyuva Mane (An Alternative School for Underprivileged), run by Divya Deepa Charitable Trust, Kenchalagudu Village, Manandavady Road, Rayanakere Post, Jayapura Hobli, Mysore: 570 008, Karnataka, resident of #59, Narayanapura, Pandavapura Taluk, Mandya District: Karnataka, bearing CRF Nos. 495884, was registered on 13th May, 2019, at this Institute. As per records, the student is diagnosed as functioning at the intellectual level of **“Average Intelligence-Academic Delay and Learning Difficulties”**. Past history shows normal developmental milestones. His current level of intelligence and adaptive behavior as assessed on standardized psychological tests is age appropriate (IQ: 100) with overall grade level matching primary school. There is belated change of medium at class seventh class which partly explains the academic delay in the student.

The student shows difficulties in solving divisions with zero in numerator. He has problems in reading, writing or spellings of class three upwards in English and Kannada (although his primary and middle school was in English medium), does not solve LCM/HCF, cannot explain fractions, prime numbers or integers, and does not give out formula for simple/compound interest or measurements in middle school level basic geometry.

The student requires a structured learner paced remedial teaching program with stress on oral and practical skills rather than theory driven writing work. Owing to his condition, the student falls under the category of ‘children with special needs’ or ‘disadvantaged child’ and becomes entitled for benefits or concessions especially those related to inclusion in regular school, avoidance of pressurized learning, providing learner paced activity based instruction, allowance for oral work in place of writing, extra time, choice of alternate subjects, and objective type question papers to accommodate the slowness in the child. Periodic review is recommended at this institute before a final diagnostic decision is undertaken next year.

- Her mother was working as a peon in Andhra Pradesh school.
- Her maternal uncle brought her to Mysore. She was admitted to a formal school. But she could not cope up with the rigours of the formal school.
- So, her uncle brought her to Kaliyuva Mane. A simple informal test revealed her academic lag. As per the clinical psychological report of All India Institute of Speech & Hearing, her IQ was 100, but scholastic performance level was at 4th standard (Primary school) at an age of 13 years.
- At Kaliyuva Mane, she was given special attention. She cleared class X exam in 2018 from Prajna team.
- This simple success restored her lost confidence. She went on

clear to II PUC and now BCA scoring 81% marks in final semester. Happy to inform that Divya completed BCA scoring 81% marks in the final semester.

- She cracked CET and is pursuing MCA.

- Jyothi Shree G (18 years) is from a rural backward family. Her parents were illiterates.
- She lost her father at a very young age.
- She joined Kaliyuva Mane as a day scholar, but was irregular. Her parents took her to clinical psychology department of AIISH, Mysore. As per the report, her IQ was 100 and she was suffering from a huge academic delay.
- She joined Kaliyuva Mane as a resident scholar in the year 2018. She got educated on an alternative education philosophy, "School for CHILDREN rather than Children for SCHOOL".

- She passed the 10th standard Board exam in English medium in the year 2022, scoring 51.5% marks.
- She completed her Diploma in “Health Care Assistance” from Teresian College recently.
- Joyous Jyothi recently visited Kaliyuva Mane with a box of sweets and announced her success in life. Presently she is working as a nurse in “Ayushman Health Care.”

- As per the psychological report by All India Speech & Hearing (AIISH), Mysore, his IQ was 100 & academic level was 4th standard at the age of 15 years. Koushik was dyslexic.
- Koushik grabbed the second chance very well. At the age of 18, he completed class X board exam in English medium, from ‘Chinmayi’ team.

About 130 persons stay on the campus in Kaliyuva Mane. We had a temporary Sewage Treatment plant to dispose sewage generated by these 130 persons. Now with the permission from Dhanagalli Grama Panchayat and financial support from P. Mangatram Jewellers Pvt. Ltd. Hyderabad, Kaliyuva Mane sewage was connected to the Centralized Sewage Treatment system of Karnataka Housing Board.



(v) Vehicle (Maruthi Echo):

Our organization is situated 16 kms away from the centre of the city with poor facilities. Children need an exposure to the outside world. Visits to places such as markets, shopping complexes, environment friendly parks, famous sight-seeing places of Mysuru, not only enhances their knowledge, but also drives away their boredom.

A Van is also required to take children to hospitals, to bring groceries, vegetables and fruits, to bring visitors, for repair and maintenance works etc.

(iii) Independence Day Celebration


